Escuela Tlatelolco Centro de Estudios

Escuela Tlatelolco, a PreK through 12th grade, nonprofit school was founded in 1970 by Chicano Rights leader Rudolfo “Corky” Gonzales. For the last thirty years Escuela Tlatelolco has educated students with the following mission:

To liberate the mind, heart, and spirit of students, through the knowledge of their cultural expression, moral courage and honorable behavior.

To empower students to think critically and creatively, challenging them to embrace their own history, acknowledge and embrace their self-worth and develop a commitment to social justice.

To reinforce education as knowledge learned and shared.

Recent Accomplishments of Escuela Tlatelolco

Escuela Tlatelolco was recently named by *5280 Magazine* as one of *Denver’s Top Schools* recognizing the school for its diverse student body, teacher engagement, community-oriented approach that engages parents, and the schools notable academic improvement over two or more years.

Using an educational model which focuses on each student’s individual talents as well as their contributions to the entire classroom community has also proven effective in improving traditional testing scores. Escuela Tlatelolco’s 7th – 10th graders outperformed DPS district students 64% of the time on the 2007 CSAP tests, scoring Proficient or Above in Reading, Writing, Mathematics and Science.

Escuela Tlatelolco Educational Model

Preschool – 6th grade classrooms at Escuela Tlatelolco are a Montessori, dual-language (Spanish and English) program. Escuela students at this level typically test above their developmental and grade level.

The multi-age 7th, 8th and 9th grade classroom blends Montessori elements in a self-contained classroom with an off-site experiential component.

The Upper School (grades 10 – 12) is a bilingual, experiential program that works with students who have struggled in typical public school settings and may be at-risk of dropping out. The dedicated teachers of Escuela Tlatelolco engage these students and provide them an environment where they can express themselves and individualize their educational experience.
